


# Perley Lutheran Parish May 3rd 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter

### Children's Message:

Today I am going to quote some popular phrases from some pretty famous characters and one real person. After I say the phrase, you have to do one thing to show me you know the answer. No, it's not to raise your hand. When you think you know the answer, I need you to "Baa" like a sheep. Are you ready?

Go through each of the five phrases and allow kids chances to "Baa" and guess the answer. After they guess, show them the picture that goes with each phrase.

- "To infinity and beyond." Buzz Lightyear
- "Some people are worth melting for." Olaf
- "Just keep swimming." Dory
- "Me want cookie." Cookie Monster
- "In every job that must be done, there is an element of fun." Mary Poppins

Was it easy or hard to guess who said each of these things? How could you be certain of who said each phrase?

You had to be pretty familiar with the movie and character to match their saying with the person saying it. If you had never seen the movie "Finding Nemo" you may not know that Dory says "Just keep swimming." But if you have seen Frozen like 100 times, you could guess Olaf really easily. The more you know the movie and character, the better you know their voice. I have one more voice for you to guess.

"Love each other as I have loved you." Who do you think said that? "Baa" when you want to guess.

Show children the picture of Jesus after they've guessed.

Jesus is not a cartoon character; He is the Good Shepherd who takes care of us. Jesus says that His sheep know His voice and follow Him.

#### Message:

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen

I had hoped to show you a video this morning – it's a vide by Rodney Atkins and the song that he is singing is called "Watching You". The premise of the song is that the singer is a dad to a 4-5-year-old son. They are just hanging out on the farm and need to then head in the truck somewhere. The father picks up a happy meal for the son (his favorite of course) and while driving the dad needs to slam on his brakes and the French fries go flying. The young boys response is not what the dad expects. The son blurts out a cuss word and the dad looks at the son in astonishment. The song then goes into the chorus:

"I've been watching you, dad. Ain't that cool? I'm your buckaroo, I want to be like you".

Well the dad takes this to heart and the video shows the dad praying in the barn and of course later that night the video shows the son doing the same at his bedside. The song goes on "he closed his little eyes, folded his little hands ad spoke to God like he was talking to a friend and I said, 'Son, now where'd you learn to pray like that?"

"I've been watching you, dad. Ain't that cool? I'm your buckaroo, I want to be like you".

I know that there were times when my boys were little that I saw them doing and saying and acting the way I and their dad had. They see things that we don't even know they see, right?? Remember the first time they cuss – just like in that video – and you realize that their little ears were tuned in unfortunately when you were having a "moment" as a parent. We are models – we are what they want to be when they grow up – and we are definitely required as parents to set a good example.

We all have role models in our lives. People that we looked to and watch as we grew up. I had a lot of wonderful, good and kind people as a child that helped me to become the person I am. In my spiritual life I had many people who helped me to understand and see where God can and should be in my life. I grew up spending a week or two in the summer visiting my grandmas in Ada MN. When I would stay there I would go to Grace Lutheran with my grandma Gorze for church – I loved the beautiful stained glass windows and the lights that hung from the ceilings. I always thought those lights had the suits of a deck of cards, hearts and diamonds and clubs and spades. I don't know if they do but as a kid that's what they looked like to me. After church, we would walk back home to her little house and while lunch was cooking in the oven, she and I would sit at the piano bench and play and sing the hymns that we had heard that morning in the service. We would end our evenings with prayers before bed and she always held God very dear and close to her heart. She was a wonderful role model for me.

For all of us, our parents are of course our first role models Like that little boy, we want to be the buckaroo or the mini-mom that we see our parents being. We learn from them how to act and how to have manners and treat others with a kind heart and caring way.

As we grow though there become so many more people and role models that mold our actions and beliefs. We of course have those that we see in history – those amazing people who formed and built our country and our freedom. There are the coaches, and the teachers and the bosses who help us do our best and get as far as we wish to go. We honestly, can never have too many role models – at least not GOOD role models. I've listed many options and people for us to look to for examples but let's be honest, there really is only one that can be the greatest role model of all and that is Jesus Christ.

When I was in college – the first of my three times I might add – there was a huge popularity in the WWJD – or What Would Jesus Do – phenomenon. It was popular because it was supposed to help us all

remember to think about our actions, our comments, our responsibilities based upon what Jesus would've done or said or thought. When we wondered what to do or how to respond we could quickly answer that simple question – what would He do to shed a little light or guidance. Direction for us on how to proceed. Sometimes just take that moment – a second to stop and think – is even enough to help you to do and say what is right.

We really have no greater role model – or example of how to live our lives – than Jesus. He came to be and dwell among us and completely emptied himself to be beside and with us in the form of man. He was born like you and I, he grew up with a mom and a dad like you and I, he felt pain and sickness like you and I, and he did it all for just one reason. His entire life among us was to lead him to his death. His end, the cross, was all he came here for – to die and rise and give us forgiveness and life everlasting.

Our Gospel today finds Jesus describing his actions as those of a shepherd – the good shepherd to be exact. A shepherd who is good at the job does everything they possibly can to protect their sheep. Everything, including laying down his life to protect the life of the sheep when those of evil – for a shepherd it came in the form of a four-legged creature like a wolf, or jackal or coyote. For Jesus, our shepherd, he faced those attacking his sheep in the form of sin and death. There wasn't anything simple or easy about defeating these attackers, it would require all that Jesus was and had. He would give his life for us to defeat death. He would have to give his life up for ours.

Jesus tells them what his intentions are "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." His sole purpose for coming, his sole purpose to life and die was so that we may have life, and have life abundantly. We have this life because he gave his and it's an amazing gift from God. God's created everything and everything we have and are is because of God. A relationship that only God could create for us and one that was given through the saving actions of the Son.

Well, what do you suppose we should do then with this amazing gift? How do we live in Jesus' image and care for others, use our gifts and do as the good shepherd did? Faith in God doesn't necessarily make our life and easier, or even solve all our problems once and for all. What it our faith does do is help us to know that when we are following God and have faith in Him we are following the right path. We are moving in the right direction – a future that filled with abundance and with peace. God's goodness and love will pursue us and as we look to the kingdom of God and his righteousness. It is worth that troublesome journey of life because we trust God for bringing us to that perfect destination. Taking us home where we will be the guests of honor to God Almighty our Host.

If we find ourselves not listening to God's guidance in our lives, if we don't listen to His voice and keep Him close, we may not only find ourselves separated from Him but also wandering in the wilderness of this life. We may find ourselves lost in this life and not knowing where to go – we may find ourselves the lost sheep. Only when we follow and listen to His voice can we be assured of his presence with us. And when he is with us, we are safe from whatever circumstance may come our way.

We may not be saints – there are many things in our lives that make God sad. We need to repent for those things that we do and say and think. We need to seek God's forgiveness and reconciliation. "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. <sup>8</sup> All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. <sup>9</sup> I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture..... I came that they may have life and have it abundantly." Here is the truth about an abundant life: in God's abundant grace, our Good Shepherd has given us more than just enough. Because having a full life doesn't depend on our level of comfort, our level of health, our level of wealth or any other thing that this world can give to us. The abundant life Jesus promised you and I is one filled with the things of God: the promise of his abiding presence every days, peace with God through his blood, his protection from thine

enemies – both physical and spiritual, his unwavering and unending love, his abundance mercy and forgiveness, the absolute certainty of salvation.

Those are the things your shepherd died for. Those things are yours whether you are healthy or sick, rich or poor. Those are things no one can take away from you. Those are the thing a full, content, joyful and abundant life is made of. Today and every day our Good Shepherd calls to us. Listen to His voice and he will keep you safe and lead you to a life full of blessing now and forever in this home and in heaven. Amen


