

Praise the LORD, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion! For he strengthens the bars of your gates; he blesses your children within you. He grants peace within your borders; he fills you with the finest of wheat. He sends out his command to the earth; his word runs swiftly. He gives snow like wool; he scatters frost like ashes. He hurls down hail like crumbs—who can stand before his cold? He sends out his word, and melts them; he makes his wind blow, and the waters flow. He declares his word to Jacob, his statutes and ordinances to Israel. He has not dealt thus with any other nation; they do not know his ordinances. Praise the LORD!

First Reading Jeremiah 31:7-14

For thus says the LORD: Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, "Save, O LORD, your people, the remnant of Israel." See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor, together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back, I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn. Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock." For the LORD has ransomed Jacob, and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion, and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the LORD, over the grain, the wine, and the oil, and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall become like a watered garden, and they shall never languish again. Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry. I will turn their mourning into joy, I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow. I will give the priests their fill of fatness, and my people shall be satisfied with my bounty, says the LORD.

Holy Gospel according John 1:1-18, Glory to you O Lord

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known. The Gospel of our Lord, **Praise to you, O Christ**

Children's Message

Object: A gift you received for Christmas; heart stickers; a box; wrapping paper; tape; scissors

Before the sermon, put the heart stickers inside the box and wrap it.

This gift I am holding was one of my Christmas gifts. Did you receive gifts for Christmas? (Pause.) What was your favorite gift? (Give the children an opportunity to tell you about their favorite gifts.)

There's one thing I've learned about Christmas gifts. No matter how much you enjoy receiving them, they just don't last forever. If you got nice, new clothes, eventually they'll wear out, go out of style, or you'll outgrow them. Even if you got a fun toy you really enjoy, eventually it could break or you'll grow tired of it. Maybe you got candy in your stocking, but when you eat it, it's gone.

But there's one Christmas gift that's different. (Show the wrapped box.) It never wears out. It never goes out of style. You'll never grow out of it. It's the true gift that Christmas is all about. It's God's gift to us: His Son, Jesus. (Have kids pass the box around, each making one rip until the whole gift is unwrapped. Open the box and give each child a heart sticker to represent God's gift of love, Jesus.)

The Bible tells us that all who receive Jesus and believe in His name become the children of God! When we become the children of God, we have all of the rights and privileges of being His child. God will love us, protect us, and provide everything that we need. The best part is that it never ends. In Psalm 23:6, the Bible says that kindness and love will be with us every day of our life and we will live forever in God's house.

I enjoy giving and receiving gifts at Christmas, but I think it's important to remember the greatest gift of all was God's gift to us. It's the gift that keeps on giving!

Dear God, we thank You for loving us so much that You gave Your Son so we too can become Your children. In Jesus' name, amen.

Message

"There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world."

The light – we all need and respond to light. I don't know about you but the Candlelight service for Christmas Eve was simply beautiful. It was amazing because of all that glowing and flickering candle light. It really brought a true sense of wonder and calmness to the service and made it much more bearable for me us to worship together apart. As humans we not only respond to light but we need light. Things happen – we work and we play – when we have sunlight and daylight. The suns light gives us energy and a desire to be active – it literally gives life to plants and for our bodies it lifts the production of Vitamin D and other hormones that can help boost your mood, alleviate depression, increase endorphins and improve your mental outlook. And we can't forget the moonlight and the stars in the dark sky. Of course we know the importance of the star on that first Christmas but for us every day – moonlight and stars give us something to watch and study in the darkness.

Think about it – there are other kinds of lights as well in our lives and in our world. We of course have electricity – the power behind all of those Christmas lights we've been seeing, the reason that our homes are warm and our lights are lit. We just have to flick a switch and things turn on and light up – we're actually pretty spoiled with our ease of it all. Or what about lights from chemicals – like the power we get from batteries, or candles, or matches or oil and gasses? Things can be lit and burned to give us more light – and light in different colors even. And what about techy people and lasers – did you know that we get laser light by squeezing a rock material with electricity? All of these things will light and stay lit as long as they have fuel – something to burn or create power.

It's really just been days since we heard of the amazing light – that radiant star in the sky that led everyone to Bethlehem. Go to the stable, look in the manger and see for yourself. There he is, the Son of God, born to ordinary people like Mary and Joseph. Actually the whole thing IS pretty ordinary to those who don't know. Had the messengers, the angels not have come to tell the good news – no one would have known just by what was going on – oh except for that star. That star that pointed the way for the wise-men.

In the beginning, Jesus really was pretty ordinary. He was just like you and I – flesh and blood – and even though some knew what they had been told about his purpose – there wasn't anything really early on that would lead anyone to believe this baby would be the Light of the World. But wait, that's another form of light that I forgot to mention in the beginning of this message. A person can be a light – we all know of those people who can enter into a room and just have a sense of presence and light about them. They bring a calmness, or they can bring an excitement, or they can even bring a sense of wonder to a space but they do so in a manner that just seems to fill the space and the moment with light. They have an inner beacon of purpose and service to others – the kind of people that I love to be with and really miss these days when we aren't with other people much.

John in this passage is John the Baptist. John has been baptizing those who come and gather with him in hopes that they can be washed in the river of Jordan. People saw John – despite his horrific and rough and rugged appearance – as a Prophet sent from God. He too thought was really pretty ordinary, flesh and blood

moved by God to do for others and to teach people about the true light of the world. Many came to see John - came to be baptized – even Jesus came to be baptized. Jesus at this point wasn't much different than the rest of those that had come to see John – he too was pretty ordinary until John set them all straight. God would move John to tell everyone that Jesus is the Light of the World. That Jesus would be the savior of us all.

John wasn't the only one who was called to see Jesus – there were a variety of messengers that God sent – Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, the angels, the wise men. All heard the Word of God and came to see this baby, to stand before Jesus, the light of the world in a manger in a stable. All came to see and some perhaps came wondering not only what they would see but what they would experience.

Sure, initially they saw a baby – one that didn't look any different than any other baby they had seen before. But as he grew and learned and began to teach those that were with him learned that he was so much more than ordinary. There was a light within him – God's light that drew people to him, that helped people to believe his teaching and that filled them with the love of God. They all left Bethlehem – the shepherds, the wise men and all that had come to see knowing that there was something more to this baby. Something that wasn't going to disappear that night but rather would bring them a faith and joy that only a great light could give them.

God sent Jesus to be ordinary – to be like us. He did this so we could relate to him, we could get close to him and we could learn from him. He would be ordinary like a baby that we hold in our arms, like a friend we walk and talk with, like someone you share a meal with and someone you may laugh with and cry with. Someone who is a good friend – a person that we could believe in. And yet, Jesus is so much more than that – Jesus is the Son of God. Through his love for us – no matter who we are or what we do or do not do – he wants us to shine in our life. He wants to provide us with an everlasting hope, a never-ending peace, an abundance of Joy and a forever love that only God can give.

I'm always reminded when we come to this Gospel about one of my favorite verses in Scripture. It is a verse that has now been incorporated into the Baptism service and it is done after the blessing of the child with water "in the name of the Father, and the +Son and the Holy Spirit." A candle is lit and the following verse is spoken from Matthew 5 – verse 16: "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." We are marking the baptized with the sign of the cross, naming them as children of God and sending them – and their light – out to do God's work in order to glorify Him.

We sure can't know what 2021 is going to hold for us. We clearly can hope and pray that it will be better than 2020 was. What we can know however is that God is a God of love. God loves us no matter what the situation may indicate or what we may feel or do or not do. We also know that we are children of God and that we are filled with a light and a relationship with God that he created for us to live in. Spend time with God. Discover God's love for you in the scriptures or in your actions loving and serving others. Talk to Jesus and pray to him. Walking in a relationship with Him, He becomes our light and life. He is what we need and he moves in our lives so that we may experience life in its fullness. Through all this we can discover that our life is changing as Jesus meets our every needs. Only a Great Light can do this. Amen
