Confession and Forgiveness

Friends in Christ, in the Lenten season we heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving peace of reconciliation. On this day let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor and enter the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord with God and each other.

The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

## Children's Message

Hello, children of God! How many of you have pets – you know I have puppies, right but I also have a cat. How do you think we should take care of our pets? We make sure they have food and water, and a safe place to stay. We help to take them outside when they need to and I play with it!

My Asher and Melvin and even Max my cat Max know my voice. If I call them, they recognize me and come – at least the puppies do most of the time. The cat – well you know how cats are. If I say let's eat – they always come running. They know that I care about them and will take care of them. In a tiny way, this is a little bit like being a shepherd.

Do you know what a shepherd does? A shepherd is responsible for taking care of sheep. There are some people who are shepherds now, but in the times of the Bible there were even more of them. The shepherd would guide the sheep to places where they could find grass to eat, water to drink, and a place to rest. Sheep are not always terribly smart, but they learn to follow the shepherd.

They know when he is talking to them and follow along, recognizing that he will lead them to good things. If a wolf or a bear tries to come attack the flock, the shepherd must protect his sheep, and be willing to fight off the predator.

In our Gospel today, Jesus compared Himself to a shepherd. He said that He was the gateway. He is the way to life, we are like sheep, wandering around and needing guidance. We can trust in Jesus to provide for us and to protect us. He said that a good shepherd would even lay down his life for the sheep, and that's exactly what Jesus did!

We can trust in His promises and rejoice that our shepherd has rescued us from sin and death. We can listen for His voice through prayer, Scripture, and discernment. And we know that He cares. Each

of us is precious in God's eyes, and we can rest assured that He listens when we call to Him, and gives us life. What a blessing! We should thank God for that...

Thank you for being the Good Shepherd. Help us to listen for your voice and to follow you and trust you. We know you will guide us and protect us. Thank you for caring about us. Thank you for your love. In Jesus name, Amen!

### Message

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen

This morning we are going to be looking at Jesus as the Good Shepherd. There isn't a church anywhere I would guess that doesn't have some kind of picture or stained glass windows – like right over there – in which Jesus isn't portrayed as a shepherd either surrounded by or carrying sheep in his arms. We all had that picture of Jesus with a shepherd around his back, nestled over his shoulders, in our Sunday Schools growing up I would guess. The idea of Jesus as the shepherd and us as his sheep is a common story and very good image of how we are being watched and cared for as a shepherd watches and cares for his sheep. We understand that part of our Gospel and we remember those images but for me there is a part of this passage that is even more wonderful and the idea that I am going to focus on this morning.

Facebook – you either love it or hate it. Some of us are on it all of the time and some of us are not only NOT on it but will NEVER be on it! Besides Google and You tube it's the third most popular website. So why do you think people like it so much?? I'm sure we all have stories about things that are bad about it – but what do you think is so good about it?? I'm sure if you asked people who are into human behavior and why people do what they do you would get all kinds of answers and theories. The one that I did find and liked the best said that Facebook allows you to do two things – it let's you know and keep up with others AND it's lets others know and keep up with you. I do love how it has brought myself and many of my childhood friends and classmates back in contact so perhaps this theory is a good one. We all can post pictures, write opinions (we sure saw and read a lot of that over the last year haven't we), let others know what and how you are doing and you can check out what others are posting as well to keep in touch. We can be known and know others.

Let's be honest, post of us want to be known and want to know others too. Jesus said in our Gospel this morning *"I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father."* Jesus is telling us he knows us. Take a look around at those who are sitting here this morning – which of these people do you really know? Does anyone in this sanctuary REALLY know you – what you do and what you think each and every day? What you want and wish and hope for? What scares you and what you day dream about? Does and can anyone really know you – know all of this about you? They might know your church version, they might know your Facebook version, they might even live with you and know a lot about you and all of those answers but no one can really know everything – in fact, we might not want everyone TO know everything because they might not like us if they did. Right?? You know I love Giraffes, some of you know I hate vegetables, you know I love spending time with my family and serving others but that's what you see or what I have told you. You don't know everything about me and I surely don't know everything about you - but that's not the case for the Good Shepherd.

For Jesus, every single day of our lives is like "speak your mind day" in that he KNOWS it all. He knows us and every image we have in our mind, everything thought that we may have and he sees it all. You can't keep secrets from him – he knows everything and yet he gives us a miracle – he loves us despite all of what he sees and hears. He knows the real us and he loves us anyways. He is our Good Shepherd even though he sees our sins and thoughts and words and deeds. He forgives us of all that is not good and he loves us anyways. Love us so much that he lays down – he died on that cross for us – gave his life for us.

Isn't it a blessing? He knows our sins and forgives them all. He knows our fears and our worries and our hopes and he's a part of them all. When he looks at you and I, he knows what's ahead – what our life will hold and what we will rejoice in and what we will struggle with. He knows his sheep and we know him. Now I would love to say that I have “friended” him on Facebook but we all know that's a bit silly. What I can say is that he is there for us – an open book to us – in the writings of the Word. If you think about it, the Bible has all the pictures, all the images and opinions you'll ever need to know about Jesus Christ. It is the place that you can visit (wouldn't it be amazing if we had the time to check the Bible out as many times as we may check Facebook out each day) to know what the Good Shepherd is thinking, to let him tell you and remind you that he loves you so very much that he laid down his life for you.

We've talked before about relationships – and how Jesus wants us in relationships with him and with other brothers and sisters in Christ. God wants a personal relationship with us and invites us to call him Father – like a Shepherd is to his sheep – God is a father to his sons and daughters. The idea of God wanting a personal relationship with each and every one of us is really incomprehensible isn't it?? How can he know every single one of us? It's true and when you think about it it is a bit humbling in knowing that he died for us so he could know and love us.

We have a constant invitation to be in a deeper relationship with God as he is always wanting us to trust and love him more – he wants us to know that he knows us and trust that he has us. He wants our relationship with him to be more grace filled, more abundant, trusting, forgiving and loving.

The Good shepherd – and the image that comes to us – is one of warmth, invitation and personal in that it resonates with God's desire to be in relation with you and your desire to be in relation with God. Jesus set himself apart from other shepherds – it's not normal for shepherds to lay down their lives for livestock such as sheep – but our Good Shepherd did. That's because we are worth everything to our God, we are valuable and His. We really are blessed and can rejoice in knowing that Jesus chose each of us as his sheep and to be OUR Good Shepherd. Let's hear it once more, “I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep” Let's pray.

Dear Lord Jesus, thank you for being our Good Shepherd. You know our sins, and you forgive us. You know our fears, and you comfort us. You know our weaknesses, and you strengthen us. Help us to know you, all of our days. Amen.

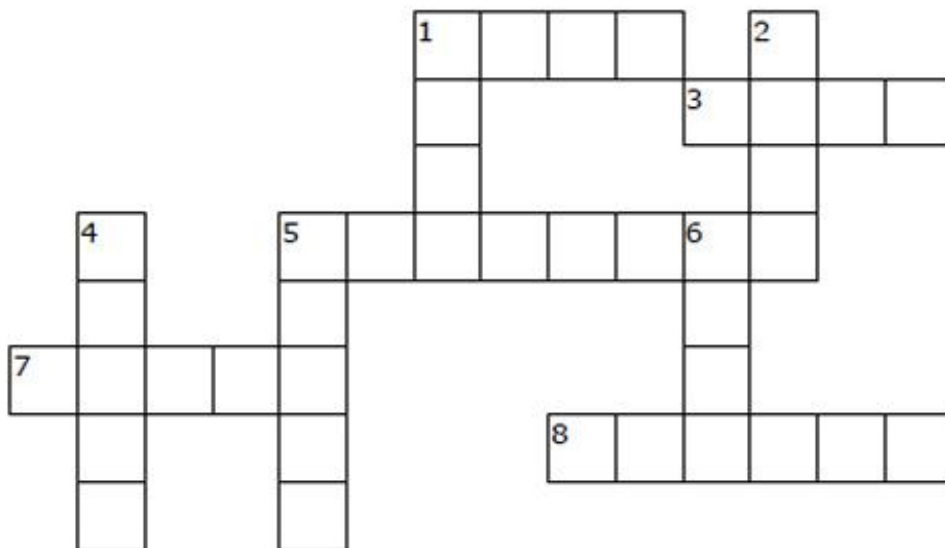

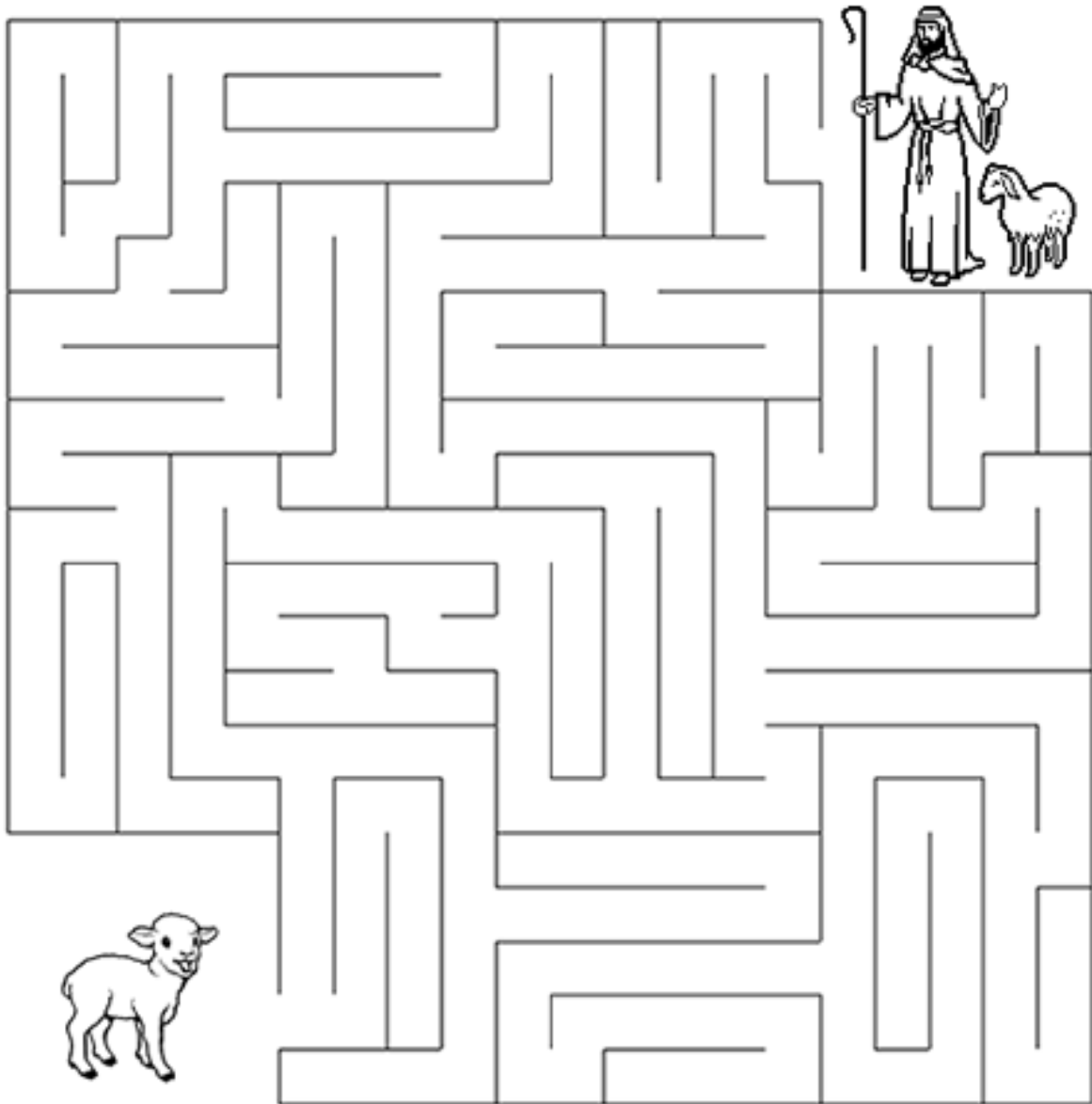
