Confession and Forgiveness

Friends in Christ, in the Lenten season we heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil-all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Children's Message

As you see, we have balloons today. You can have a lot of fun with a balloon. Hold up your balloon if you have a long, skinny one. (Pause.) I've seen some people who can take a long, skinny balloon and make it into the shape of different animals. Have you ever tried that? Hold up your balloon if you have a round one. (Pause.) I've played a game where we toss round balloons up into the air to see how long we can keep it up without it hitting the ground. That's a lot of fun.

Look at the balloon I'm holding. I think it's a very nice balloon. It's a pretty color, and by looking at the shape of it, I think it would be a very nice round balloon. There seems to be something lacking in the balloon. Can anyone tell me what this balloon needs? (Pause for children to answer.) You're right. It needs to be filled with air! Before a balloon can fulfill its purpose, someone must breathe some life into it.

I think this balloon can help us learn something about the church. Today is a very special day we call Pentecost. It was the day that God sent His Holy Spirit to breathe life into His church so the church would be all that God intended for it to be. (Inflate the balloon a little and stop.) Before God sent His Holy Spirit, the church was lifeless--like this balloon. The church was not witnessing and telling people about Jesus. After the Holy Spirit breathed life into the church, people began telling everyone they saw about Jesus. (Inflate the balloon a little and stop.) It didn't even matter if they spoke the same language. (Inflate the balloon a little and stop.) Everyone they told about Jesus understood what they were saying. Thousands of people were added to the church. (Inflate the balloon a little and

stop.) The church became alive and was doing the things God had commanded. (Finish inflating the balloon and tie it off.)

Breathe life into your balloon, and remember that just as the balloon needs to be filled to be what it was intended to be, you and I need the Holy Spirit to fill us so we can be all that God wants us to be. (Allow children to inflate their balloons. Then help them tie off their balloons.)

We thank You, God, for sending Your Holy Spirit. We thank You for breathing life into the church and we thank You for giving Your Holy Spirit to all who believe in Jesus. In Jesus' name we pray, amen.

Message

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen

Because we will not be having services next Sunday, it was important to me to look at both Pentecost and Trinity Sunday in my message this week. Both are so important and really do go together in that the Spirit is finally brought in with the Father and the Son and we receive the three in one in these two weeks. I would like to thank Pastor Kevin Ruffcorn for his message that helped me to craft this two for one message for you.

This Sunday is Pentecost – the day that the Spirit came upon the disciples like a mighty wind with flames of fire and the ability to communicate the gospel of Jesus Christ in other languages. I always marvel at the different ways in which this phenomenon is imagined or even portrayed in movies we have watched. Sometimes you will literally see the depiction of ghost-like wind flowing through the upper room where the disciples have gathered. Other times you see all those gathered speaking and joyfully conversing in language after language – such a sight I cannot imagine what that would be like. I mean not knowing another language and all of the sudden you hear yourself speaking to another in a language that is not your own. What an amazing and shocking experience that would be.

For us Lutherans, we don't quite often think of the Spirit in the way of talking in tongues – we are mostly Scandinavian around here so even getting you to sit in a front pew is impossible to expect you to break out in another language seems a bit extreme. The Pentecostals though, that is indeed another story in which the more boisterous and spirit-filled they are gathered the better it is. Again, not what you will find in our little town MN and ND churches. For us, the Spirit comes upon us at the time of our baptism, when God claims us as his own and adopts us into his family. If we come to faith later in our lives, the Spirit comes upon us when we receive the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection and begin to live by faith in its reality. The Spirit is among us; he is part of our lives. In the gospel lesson today, Jesus tells his disciples how the Spirit will reveal himself to them in their daily lives. Jesus' words both comfort us and challenge us.

Next Sunday is Trinity Sunday – the Sunday in which we are shown the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Let me read a passage about Trinity Sunday – found in Matthew 28:

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. ¹⁷ When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." ^[2] Jesus says to his disciples that he will send the Holy Spirit to them. When

the Holy Spirit comes upon them, the Spirit will guide them and reveal to them the truth—the truth that Jesus tells the Spirit to share. There is a unity of purpose that we see in this relationship, and an interaction between the persons of the Trinity that demonstrates a close, intimate relationship.

This passage also tells us that the Spirit has come. The Spirit has come and he has stayed. God is with us and God is involved in our lives. It is true that God broke into the world and our history in the person of Jesus Christ. At Jesus' ascension, however, God did not SEPARATE himself from us but rather continues to be involved in our lives in the person of the Holy Spirit. God is present with us. God is interested in our lives and what happens to us. The Spirit is actively a part of us.

The focus of the Spirit's presence in our lives is that of relationship. We do not perform a series of empty rituals that communicate some historical event. Our daily lives are not built around tradition. We walk with God in a dynamic, intimate relationship with our creator. We sing songs of love to him in our Sunday worship. We will gather at his table in a few minutes and eat his food being refreshed and renewed by what he offers us.

I love what Jesus says to his disciples, "There is so much more I want to tell you, but you can't bear it now." Think about someone in your life that set out to begin a new adventure – especially our young graduates of last week, or those that are ending their time at one school and moving to new school – maybe middle school to high school. We can't tell them everything can we? We can't warn them that there will be hard times, there might be times when you don't feel like you fit in , there may be times when you find yourself having to make really hard decisions, there may even be times when you think you've had enough of what's going on and don't know what to do to fix things. Those of us who have been through it would have those same thoughts as some of these young people. We'd love to be able to teach them more wouldn't we, prepare them for everything, but let's be honest, they would clearly reach their limit of hearing it all. They would find a time where they have had their fill.

We must hope and pray that we have prepared them for what is coming. Through baptism and confirmation and their relationship with Jesus. We pray it will continue and that they will continue to grow in their faith. We know that they are not done with the learning process.

The life of faith is a life of learning. The Spirit moves in our lives and enlightens us. The Spirit teaches us through the events of our lives and our relationships. As we walk with God, we learn more about ourselves, our world and others. We grow in knowledge, understanding and wisdom.

There are times we forget how important it is to avail ourselves of the learning opportunities that are ours. At times, we decide we have learned enough—we don't have to study, question, and search any longer. We can put our minds and spirits in neutral and simply coast. Some of us have stopped our learning on the day of our Confirmation. When we do, we essentially are attempting to live in the world with only an eighth grade education. The Spirit is in our lives and always offers to teach us and to help us grow. He doesn't force himself upon us, but he is always available to us. As we say at the College I work at – you are never too old to learn more – and that goes for being a Christian and a disciple of God.

An unspoken element of being a follower of Jesus Christ is that Jesus leads us. One of the tasks of the Holy Spirit is to guide us. The Holy Spirit – or as I was taught as a child, the Holy Ghost, can be a really abstract theological discussion. How do you understand the Spirit being with you in your life?? Does the Spirit lead us to specific parking spaces? Determine what we are craving for dinner? Or, does the Spirit limit his leading to point out the general direction that he wants us to walk? While this may be an interesting discussion, a more important question is, "Do we ever ask the Spirit for guidance?

If it is true that we live in order to do God's will, then it is important for us to ask what God wants us to do. Asking opens us up to the possibility of being guided. Our decisions shouldn't be limited to what we can do to make the most money or place us in the greatest positions or leadership roles. We should also ask the question, "What does God want us to do?" When we see a need, a simple prayer of, "How can I help?" may lead to a ministry beyond our imagination.

We are often satisfied with a distant, impartial God. Perhaps we feel it is safer that way. If we keep God at arms-length, God won't ask us to do something we don't want to do. Still, Jesus offers us so much more. He sends the Spirit to be a part of our lives, to teach us and guide us and empower us to be instruments of God's love and God's grace. So may the spirit be with you. Amen

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


