

Confession and Forgiveness

Friends in Christ, in the Lenten season we heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving peace of reconciliation. On this day let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor and enter the celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord with God and each other.

Most merciful God,

We confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

Message

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen

Happy Mother's Day. It's a time where we show our appreciation and love to our mothers, wives, grandmothers, aunts and all of the women in our lives. They do after all do so much for us and we are grateful for that and for them.

Our Gospel this morning finds Jesus nearing the end of his time here on earth. He has had the disciples with him now for the past three years and they have watched all that he has done. Casting out demons, healing the sick and raising the dead, giving sight to the blind, calming of the storms, feeding thousands with little... the list goes on and on. Such amazing, amazing experiences and Jesus has taught many things about life, about God, about the world and yes, about themselves. Our Gospel this morning attempts to wrap ALL of it into on little package. Everything that has gone on can be summed up with one word and that one word is love.

Think for a moment about love, or perhaps even the lack of love. It's a very powerful part and force in our lives isn't it? We hear all about it every time we turn the radio on, read books, watch shows and movies – it's really everywhere. We all crave love and need and want it in our lives. We also know that love is very fragile. One can easily lose or ruin love by being hateful or prejudice, judgmental and unforgiving. There are times when it is so very difficult if not almost impossible to love someone when they have hurt or offended you so deeply too. Those wounds run deep and we have a hard time knowing and feeling the love for those that have harmed us. But even in the midst of those struggles – do I forgive them? Can I still love them? - Jesus not only reminds us of love's importance but he gives us instructions on how to keep love central in our lives.

First of all, in order to be centered in love we need to look at verse 16 of our Gospel. Jesus says "*You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear much fruit.*" Remember we talked about bearing fruit last week – not apples and oranges fruit but rather kindness, generosity, faithfulness. We are chosen to do this – each and every one of us have been chosen by God.

How many of you remember when you were part of a school yard pick. Thankfully I don't think they do that anymore – I remember my grandson talking about how people are numbered off so it's a bit more random. We all remember a time however when you were going to play a game and two team leaders took turns picking their team. I will tell you truthfully, I was ALWAYS one of the lasts to be picked in gym and out on the playground. I'm not fast, I'm not strong, I'm not athletic period and all though I knew that I wasn't any of those it didn't make me feel any better when every person was picked one by one BEFORE me. For me it wasn't a big deal, I knew I excelled in other areas but for

some that being picked last is painful. Especially if it happens over and over in many different areas and situations. It can leave a mark on one's life. And being chosen? Well that IS an exhilarating moment to know you are wanted and chosen.

We can know that same feeling of love with Jesus in that we too have been picked and chosen too. God's actions aren't based of course on all the good things we've done but rather just a gift for being His. We don't know why, we can't explain it and yet he has chosen and loved us no matter what. We are forever blessed.

Let listen again to verses 9 & 10, "*As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.*" We hear the word abide again – we talked a lot about that last Sunday. Abide, remain, continue, stand, and persist, in my love. We are invited to enter into God's love and take up our lives in that love. Remaining in God is hard to explain but perhaps if we think of it in another way it will help. Think of how the love and support of spouses, family or friends enables us to face whatever challenges come our way. Or how about when we send our kids off to school and college or we watch our children walk down the aisle – they remain in our love even when they are no longer with us day in and day out. Even when we are separated by miles and miles the love of others is a part of our lives. Love keeps us going and God's love works just like that.

If we dwell in the love of God it can bring us peace and contentment because we can sense God's hands upon us and know that He is living in us. When we feel things crashing down around us and face challenges that seem just too much to bear it is God's love that gives us strength and determination to get through it. Therefore, when we question God's love for us, peace and contentment can come into question as well. Not seeing or feeling God's presence in our times of grief and pain can slip us even deeper into despair and hopelessness. Our situations change in our lives but we are transformed by them when we rediscover God's love for us and we abide in that love.

Jesus tells the disciples about his love for them and that they are chosen so that they can find joy in all that they have seen, lived and loved with him. If they remain in God's love they can live each day in the reality of God's love and the peace, contentment and joy that it brings to their lives. And sharing that love with others – that allows us to experience an even greater and deeper sense of joy in our lives. He has chosen them. He has chosen us to bear fruit – good fruit. A fruit that is filled with love – love that inspires, love that motivates us to use all the gifts we were given and abilities that we possess to serve and love others. Loving others, sharing the Word, and observing how it changes our lives in a positive manner can bring great joy.

Finally we find in verse thirteen Jesus tells them "*No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.*" Clearly he is giving them a glimpse of what is ahead for his life on Earth. He is also telling US that an essential part of life is giving of yourself – giving up your lives for others – rather than living for ourselves. I'm not telling you that we have to die, literally give up our lives for someone – surely that's not what Jesus is saying to them or to us. We may however give up our own dreams, or our own goals, our own lifestyles, or even our time or treasures for others. Parents make those types of sacrifice for their children all the time, don't they? Friends often times will sacrifice something for their friend. Strangers give their lives to serve our country and others help those in need in far-away places.

If you think about it – the times when you have sacrificed or given up something for another often times result in times of great joy. I have given up my plans for the plan of another person on occasion because they could no longer drive and needed to get out of the house. You have changed your plans to go out for dinner with friends because your child has a sore throat. Another may have decided to not purchase that new outfit but rather make a donation to their food shelf when supplies are needed. Despite the loss that you give up and feel, there is a sense of relief and peace in

knowing that you did for others. You gave of yourself in order to be there for another and that is what Jesus is talking about. *“No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.”*

Love is one of the greatest creations that our Father made. As impressive as any mountain range or rolling meadow, shimmering sea or green, green forest – while all of those things are amazing – they are in no way a comparison to how great God’s creation of love is. Love is our gift and just as the Father loves the Son, eternally and unconditionally, so does Christ love us. We live IN His love and His love lives in and through us. By His love we love one another. But it is not our love, but rather His. For we are the branches, bearing fruit of faith and waiting for the time when we will be rejoicing again with Christ. Amen


