

For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." Back Pack Blessing

God gives all of us jobs; things to do that help us to serve God in the world. This is called our vocation. You have a vocation, and one of your vocations right now is to go to

school. You can serve God by going to school and learning about God's world, by being with other people, by being loving toward others. Children's Message

Message

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

After the last few weeks of Jesus' amazing miracles and blessings I was sure that I once again I would find a text that would fill my mind with an amazing and spirit-filled message. After all, we've heard about all the miracles Jesus has done for weeks now - feeding thousands with next to nothing, cleaning those with unclean spirits and disease, those who cannot walk and those that cannot hear and speak just last week. He's healed, he's raised some from the dead, he has helped Paul to realize that if he didn't let the fear take over and believed in Jesus - he could walk across the sea on top of the water. It was nothing less than a miracle to learn of the healing hands of Jesus despite the urging of his disciples to ignore and send away the Canaanite women and

her ailing daughter. What miracle or feat would I get to tell and share with you all in my message today?

Obviously, it was thrilling last week to learn that Jesus is the Savior, the Messiah and Son of God. Our Gospel ended last week with "He has done ALL things well!" But when we stop think about it - the realization of what that means and what the future holds for this Man, this Leader - can also leave us feeling a bit of sadness, of dread and even disbelief as Jesus, the man amongst them, stands before his followers and announces what is yet to come.

I can't wrap my head around what it must have been like for the disciples to sit back, to watch Jesus, and be a part of the excitement in all the amazing things he was doing. Stop to think what it was like to be standing there with people as far as the eye can see and know you have five loaves and two fish? I mean how many of us - minutes from your expected guests arriving - have had that moment of panic on whether you made a big enough turkey? Or think about the fear of having a child that is so very ill and knowing that you have no means of helping or curing them. And then this man, who looks just like most of the other men you know, comes and heals your child - while everyone is watching. Or being bedside as your brother takes his last breath only to have Jesus show up and just like that the dead becomes alive again. How could you not be drawn towards this miracle worker and not want to be with Him always?

Here they all are – gathered in the village and Jesus looks at them with the simple question "who do you say that I am?" our text says they answered him, "*John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.*" He's not like anyone else they know – they have heard of the old testament prophet Elijah, they have heard of John the Baptist and of course there are stories of others prophets out there being told. But he asks them again, "*But who do YOU say that I am?*" Peter answered him, "*You are the Messiah.*" And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

They really had no idea though on what was ahead - just what was coming Jesus's AND their way. Our text says "*Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly.*" Wait, a minute Peter's thinking.... Wait, so you have done all these amazing things, we have followed you and looked to you to lead us into a marvelous new kingdom here and this is how it's going to end??? Peter's astonishment with the whole idea of what Jesus saying had to be what all of us would've thought when He foretells the pain, torture, suffering, betrayal and of course the full plan of death. "Never Lord! This shall never happen to you!" Why would any of us believe that THIS man – the healer of so many would soon become the regions "most wanted" and the one who MUST die?

So what do they do? What would we do? As a believer sitting in His midst, would we question Him like Peter? Wonder how he could be telling the truth? Or do we sit there and realize that there is obviously something so amazingly special about Jesus? Yes, he's a man but he is not like any other and there is something in the fact that He knows what lies ahead and He is ok with it. I think one of the most favorite lines in the Bible for me – of course there are the loving and caring promises that top all things – but when Jesus looks at Peter and says "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." I just see this image of Jesus putting out his hand like superman guarding him and all those around him from Satan – a doubting evil spirit – who would make Peter question the validity of what Jesus was telling them. Jesus is calling out the doubt and the doubters to let them

know that there is more to be done and it's not going to be pretty, easy or even totally understandable. if he's ok with it should we not be ok with it too? But wait, if we believe and remain His disciple, then what does that mean for us? What lies ahead for us?

Jesus gives us an idea when He says, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Deny themselves and take up the cross. DING DING DING – my red light goes off when I begin to understand that He has is asking us to trust in Him and in doing so we will need to give up our life – all that we have and know – and just to follow Him. Give up all EVERYTHING and just take that leap of faith. We all have times in our lives when we have found ourselves needing to make decisions that are tough or seem a little scary. I just did that last summer when I finished up Seminary, was ordained and faced the decision of whether I quit my job at M State for 32 years and leave this Parish to become a full-time pastor. Do I walk away from these two churches after just two years – when I really wanted to stick around a bit longer and see what we could do next and the stability and benefits of my College job. Oh and did I mention all of these decisions needed to be made in the middle of a world-wide pandemic? Scary decisions indeed and thankfully we – meaning Kirkebo, Nora and myself – came up with a wonderful solution for the next few years. One that I hope blesses all of us in being Church together.

Change is hard and I'm sure the disciples were not only hearing the bell ring on the "leave everything behind and follow me" speech too but now?! Not there is an unplanned (at least as far as they knew) departure of their leader and things were definitely going to be changing. I truly don't think any of us are so unwilling in our lives paths to not able to adjust, move over, or accommodate a bump in road. As one of my favorite show is known for "expect the unexpected". That's from Big Brother for those that haven't heard it before. But of course, sometimes "change" means we really need to look at things differently. Trust that our paths have been changed for a reason and know that we must be able to find the flexibility inside us to adjust accordingly. The disciples – and any of us – would've longed to keep the amazing ride going just the way it was. Continue on with things status quo. Can you imagine the fascination with Jesus and what he was doing and saying – the intensity of it all? Wouldn't it be much harder to walk away FROM him than to walk away WITH Him.

Finally we can't forget about the last part of Jesus' request – "take up their cross and follow". I believe that Jesus' choice of words in this request was very intentional. First, I would believe that it is of course a reference to the means in which Jesus would meet His death and His resurrection – that's a given to me. But likewise, I have to wonder if He didn't also want them to realize that taking up that cross – taking on a burden - was going to mean that they too would have to be obedient to the Father, be a servant to the cause and be willing to die for all of it. What a burden to carry. Crosses in those days were known as a sense of punishment and laborious work and suffering.

I've told you before about my oldest son and our conversation about my beginning seminary 6 years ago to become a pastor. His response to my announcement again was "Ok, but we already have enough crosses in our house". He's probably right, as I do believe there is at more than one in every room - I'm not quite sure of his correlation with being a pastor and having too many crosses lies, but that's the mind of a child with Aspergers and their literal understanding of things, I guess.

How many of us – you – have a cross in your home, have cross that you wear around your neck or on keychain, have a cross that stands on a shelf or a coffee table? We have all found and understood the importance of the cross and therefore feel the

sense of what it means to take up the cross for Jesus. Of course there is much more to being a Christian and giving your life to him than just putting a figure on display. You can fill your house with crosses and cover your chest with them but truthfully it's the cross that you received on your forehead at the time of your baptism, and the promises that you made when you confirmed your faith at confirmation that truly matters. Honestly, it IS very reassuring to me to be reminded every time I see a cross - that someone loved me enough to give His life so I could be forgiven and be loved by my Lord and Savior. It's in knowing that by giving your heart and your soul and believing in His love and His plan that you can know that you will never be alone and that you too will be sitting with the Father when the time comes, the time that matters. He knows it won't always be easy for us, He knows there are times when we will struggle with what is asked of us, when our paths are changed and we wonder why, but He also has promised us that no matter what, He will come in his Father's glory with his angels, and then He will reward each of us according to what we have done.

Remember - "Whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it". I can't imagine a better reason to follow than that!

Please pray with me..... Heavenly Father, we are so very thankful that Jesus was willing to take up his cross and die for our sins. As his disciples, help us to take up our cross as well, forsaking all else, and follow Him. Until that day that we will see you and rejoice in your kingdom. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen!




