Holy Gospel according to Mark 10:45-52 **Glory to you O Lord**

⁴⁵ For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.”⁴⁶ They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus (Bar-tah-mee-us) son of Timaeus (Tee-may-us), a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside.⁴⁷ When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!”⁴⁸ Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, “Son of David, have mercy on me!”⁴⁹ Jesus stood still and said, “Call him here.” And they called the blind man, saying to him, “Take heart; get up, he is calling you.”⁵⁰ So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus.⁵¹ Then Jesus said to him, “What do you want me to do for you?” The blind man said to him, “My teacher, let me see again.”⁵² Jesus said to him, “Go; your faith has made you well.” Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way. The Gospel of our Lord, **Praise to you, O Christ**

In your hands, you are holding a book that is filled with words and stories which tell us about God and the love God has for us. Some of the stories are funny. Some of the stories are sad. Sometimes the people in the stories do very good things. At other times, they do very bad things. But through it all, in story after story, we read about how God continues to try to bring hope, healing, forgiveness and love into the lives of all the people - even when they don't deserve it!

Children's Message

Have any of you seen a baby recently? Do you remember when you were a baby? (Cradle the baby doll.) One thing I know about babies is that they're not shy when it comes to letting you know when they want something. They'll let you know when they're hungry, thirsty, sick, tired, or need a diaper change. Since little babies don't know how to talk, how can they tell you what they need? (Pause for responses.)

Babies let you know what they need by crying. Babies don't care if you're in church, at a movie, or eating dinner in a fine restaurant; if they need something, they'll tell you. As we get older, we learn to be more reserved about making our wants and wishes known. Or do we?

The Bible talks about a man who wasn't scared to let Jesus know he needed something. As Jesus and His disciples were leaving a town called Jericho, a blind man named Bartimaeus was sitting beside the road. When he heard that Jesus was approaching, he began to cry out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"

His crying out disturbed the people around him. "Be quiet!" they yelled at him. But he only shouted louder.

When Jesus heard Bartimaeus crying out, He stopped and said, "Tell him to come to me."

Bartimaeus jumped up, threw aside his coat, and went to Jesus.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked.

"I want to see," Bartimaeus answered.

Go," Jesus said. "Your faith has healed you." Instantly, Bartimaeus could see and he followed Jesus down the road.

Like a mother who does whatever she can to find out what her baby wants or needs, God knows we have needs and wants what's best for us. (Cradle the baby doll.) The Bible says, "Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done." (Philippians 4:6)

When you have a need in your life, don't be shy. Speak up! Remember Jesus wants you to come to Him.

Heavenly Father, we know that You love Your children and want what's best for them. Help us remember we don't need to worry about anything. All we need to do is to speak up, and ask You. In Jesus' name, amen.

Message

Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

If you were able to be with us last week or watch later on, we talked a bit about sight. Remember when I mentioned that I have readers all of the place so I can grab them if needed. Look at my script for Sunday mornings – I blow it up to 18 point font so I don't have to squint. This morning we will be continuing with this theme but let me first ask a few questions about your memory.

So today it is the 24th of October in 2021, try to think back to October of 2018 – can you remember anything about where you were and what you may have been doing? Some may be able to mention things without hesitation, others may need a few minutes to think about, and then some of us may just say they have no idea. Especially with a pandemic in the middle of those three years, right? There are some helping questions though like “Are you working at the same job as you were then? Did you have the same number of kids or grandchildren three years ago? Do you live in the same house? See, some of that you could confidently remember if they were general things like those I mentioned. But now think about what's happened SINCE October of 2018. Experiences you had – and obviously the pandemic is a huge part of this last 3 years but if we don't even consider that what about what projects have you worked on in the last three years, what movies or TV shows have you watched since then, maybe what books have you read and/or places have you gone to? Sure, if you have Facebook or and Apple I Phone you sometimes get pop ups of memories to help you but let's be honest, A LOT of things happen and change in three years.

I ask you about three years because that is about how much time the disciples were able to spend with Jesus. They traveled all over – throughout Israel at Capernaum and Nazareth, Jerusalem, Bethany and Jericho. And through all those places and all that time they spent their lives following, listening, learning and watching Jesus do amazing, amazing things. We've talked

about many of the miracles of course, the turning of water into wine at the Wedding of Cana, feeding thousands with very little, Jesus walking on water and calming storms, the dead being raised back to life, turning the blind to see, deaf to hear, and the diseased back to health. What an absolutely amazing and spectacular experience those three years must have been.

Now, however, Jesus time with them is coming to an end. He repeatedly begins to tell him what is coming – and coming soon. He will be betrayed, he will be handed over to those who don't understand, he will suffer and die at their hands and YES, he will raise from the dead three days later. Our Gospel today has Jesus and his followers gathering in Jericho. The crowds are growing and growing there as word has spread that he has not only been doing amazing things but he is actually THERE for them to see! And in and amongst the crowd is Bartimaeus.

The Bible doesn't give us a lot to go on in regards to Bartimaeus other than he is a blind man sitting and begging along the side of the road that Jesus and the crowd are passing through. He obviously has heard of who Jesus is and what he's been doing because we are told that he hollars out "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" The crowds are horrified and yelled for him to be quiet and leave them alone but Bartimeaus is not one to give up and cries out again "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And this time Jesus hears! This time Jesus tells those around him to bring Bartimeaus to him. "Take heart, cheer up, rise, he is calling you!" the crowd says as he gathers himself and comes to Jesus.

Now Bartimeaus isn't shy, he comes right out and says EXACTLY what he wants Jesus to do when he's asked. "Master, let me receive my sight." Rabbi I want to see." He didn't doubt – he trusted that Jesus had the power to do what he asked – what he wanted and what no one else could do for him. And Jesus does just what you wanted and tells him to "Go your way, your faith has made you well." Instantly he had his sight and immediately he became a follower of Jesus down that road near Jericho.

Sometimes it can be hard when you hear and read stories like this – times when you really want and need something in your own life and you don't feel like anyone is listening or anything is showing mercy for you or your loved one. It's that's crazy hard question – WHY? Why does a God who loves us and cares for us and has plans for us let something awful happen to us? Why doesn't Jesus show me some mercy too? There is a passage in Psalm 50 that says "call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me" so we should just be able to reach out, right? After all we are reaching out to the same Lord that Bartimeaus reached out to. And we therefore know and believe that He has the power to do what we want as well. But Jesus, he may choose to give us immediate results like we asked, like Bartimeaus

asked, and other times he may choose not to, as he did every other day that Bartimeaus has lived his life. WHY?

There's not an easy answer. In fact I can't even give you a definite answer as to why – why some heal and live and others do not. Maybe our difficulty to understand is what keeps us all humble and grounded in God and in need of his strength. “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness (as it says in 2 Corinthians 12:9) It is in those times of weakness that we learn to rely upon the Lord. The strength of God to deliver us and carry us through the bad and the hard and the painful. It is these times that help us focus on the eternal, help us to let go of the temporary things we have and hold in this life. We don't know the reason – there are plenty of course – why we aren't delivered always from difficulty or delivered in the timeline we want or ask for, but none of those things can diminish the amazing gift of Lord's mercy at all.

Jesus' mission of mercy wasn't just about giving people the ability to walk, talk, see, hear, cured or raised from the dead simply to die again later on. He had a much bigger mercy in mind – the “ever-lasting” kind of mercy. That mercy that goes on forever and that Jesus came here to provide permanently when he died and rose for us. Jesus is our answer when we pray for mercy. He leaves the glory and the perfection of heaven for only one reason – mercy – to help the helpless, to help us. He lives for us, he died for us, he rose from the dead for us – he is indeed everything that we need him to be for us to live in heaven. Eternal life includes life away from THIS world, away from all of THESE problems – the pain, the suffering and the disappointments – no more ever again.

Jesus came to us on a mission of mercy – a mercy that strengthens us to endure the temporary but oh so real troubles of this world. A mercy that helps us to trust his blessing THROUGH the troubles of this life. A mercy that will one day rescue you and I forever from every trouble. This IS the mercy that Jesus came to show us. Amen!

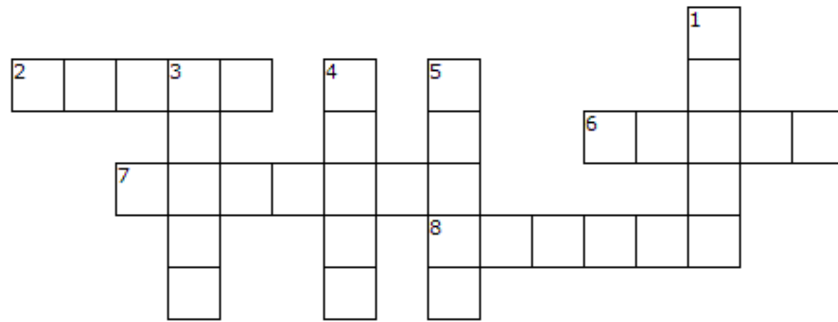
