

Psalm 147:12-20 (read responsively)

C: He sends out his command to the earth; his word runs swiftly.
L: He gives snow like wool; he scatters frost like ashes.

L: He sends out his word, and melts them; he makes his wind blow, and the waters flow.

C: He declares his word to Jacob, his statutes and ordinances to Israel.

Old Testament Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-14

For thus says the LORD: Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, "Save, O LORD, your people, the remnant of Israel." See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, those with child and those in labor, together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back, I will let them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I have become a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my firstborn. Hear the word of the LORD, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands far away; say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd a flock." For the LORD has ransomed Jacob, and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion, and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the LORD, over the grain, the wine, and the oil, and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall become like a watered garden, and they shall never languish again. Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry. I will turn their mourning into joy, I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow. I will give the priests their fill of fatness, and my people shall be satisfied with my bounty, says the LORD. Word of God, Word of Life. **Thanks be to God.**

Holy Gospel according to John 1:1-18 **Glory to you O Lord**

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴in him was life,^[a] and the life was the light of all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. ⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.^[b] ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own,^[c] and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son,^[d] full of grace and truth. ¹⁵(John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.'") ¹⁶From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son,^[e] who is close to the Father's heart,^[f] who has made him known. The Gospel of our Lord, **Praise to you, O Christ**

Preaching Text: 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. ²And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. ³If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast,^[a] but do not have love, I gain nothing. ⁴Love is patient; love is

kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant ⁵ or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; ⁶ it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. ⁷ It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸ Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. ⁹ For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; ¹⁰ but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. ¹¹ When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. ¹² For now we see in a mirror, dimly,^[b] but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. ¹³ And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Children's Message

Greetings

What or who do you think of when I say the word love?

I think of Jesus dying on the cross and I think of family and friends.

I think of one of the commandments "Honor thy Father and Mother."

When I was growing up those were the two people I looked to for guidance and security.

What is your favorite time with your mom and/or Dad?

Mine was playing catch with my dad or watching my mom bake cookies or bars. She'd let me clean the mixing bowl out after she got done baking.

Also mom and dad gave the best hugs.

So what I want you to do is give mom and dad a hug when you get a change. Just remember they are there for you just like Jesus is!

Message

The reason I took this certain text from the Bible is that it talks about the one sure thing that everyone has experienced, THAT IS LOVE.

First, the whole Old Testament law is summed up by one word LOVE. All the commandments are based on love.

Love is mentioned many time in the Bible Depending on what version you use for your Bible, ESV – 684 times, King James – 442 times, New American Standard – 479, New Living Translation – 759 and New International version – 686.

Jesus showing his love for others

Jesus told his disciples, "Love one another as I have loved you."

1. Feeding of the 5,000 Matthew 14:13-21
2. Healing of the blind man John 9:1-12

And many other stories of Jesus healing the sick, feeding the hungry, teach the people, caring for the widow and defending the children.

Stories of love form the human side of the Bible. All different kinds of love

1. Adam & Eve – the start of all of it

2. Abram & Sara
3. Isaac & Rebekah
4. Jacob & Rachel
5. Michael & David – Michael youngest daughter of Saul
6. Bathsheba & David
7. Ruth & Boaz
8. Samson & Delilah

All stories of love, not perfect love, but love in human form.

The only perfect love is from the Lord.

Five actual ways to love like Jesus

1. Be mindful, connect more deeply with people
2. Be approachable
3. Be full of grace – relate to others in less judgmental ways
4. Be bold, shed our fears
5. Be self-giving; less self-absorbed and more invested in those around us

Over and over, Jesus demonstrates these qualities to show us that they are not unattainable ideals, instead they are a doable way to get an earthly handle on heavenly ideals.

What I'm getting at is Jesus' love is never-ending. We can obtain a level of love that Jesus has. Don't be afraid to love!!!

As I end this sermon just remember,

Love is patient, love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It doesn't insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful, it does not rejoice in wrong doing, but rejoices in truth. It bears all things, endures all things. Love never ends.
